Boston Playford Ball Saturday, March 3, 2012

The English Dance Committee is pleased to present CDS-Boston's thirty-first annual Boston Playford Ball on Saturday, March 3rd, 2012 in Nevins Hall, Memorial Building, 150 Concord Street, Framingham, MA. The ball will start at 8:00 p.m. with music by Bare Necessities: Peter Barnes, Mary Lea, Earl Gaddis, and Jacqueline Schwab. There will also be an afternoon workshop for ball attendees from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. that day in Nevins Hall, led by Barbara Finney and Rich Jackson with music by Joyce Crouch and lydia ievins.

The Playford Ball is an evening of challenging English Country Dancing, with talk-throughs

only; there will be no teaching or walk-throughs at the ball. As such, it is best-suited for dancers well-familiar with both the figures and the dances on the program. Dances will be taught at the Wednesday night dances in the weeks leading up to the ball.

There will be three pre-ball workshops: Saturday, February 4th; Sunday, February 12th; and Sunday, February 26th, all from 1:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. at the Park Avenue Congregational Church, Arlington Heights. Orion Longsword 25th Anniversary

Orion Longsword has been dancing for twenty-five years. The first event of their year-long celebration was held on Saturday November 12, 2011 in Boston and Cambridge. Like an ale, there were performances in public spaces, a pub stop and a dinner and dance in the evening.

Teams attending the celebration tour and dinner/dance were Half Moon Sword of New York City, Still River Sword of Harvard MA, Pinewoods Morris Men of Greater Boston, Marlboro Sword of Marlboro, VT, and That Long Tall Sword of Amherst, MA.

Orion's dances range from traditional to modern, drawing influences from English traditions, Appalachian stepping, and jazz. Many know them as the choreographers and performers of a longsword dance to the jazz tune "Take 5."

The Orion band is an eclectic mix of musicians and instruments - from melodeon, concertina, accordion and guitar to whistles, mandolin, bouzouki, banjo and saxophones. The band recently performed at the Boston Celtic Music Festival.

Five original, founding members continue to dance on the Orion team. Orion also has members who have danced 10 or 15 years, and several dancers or musicians who weren't born yet when the team began.

Boston Intergenerational Dance Advocates

BIDA is a Boston-area group dedicated to promoting involvement in traditional dance and connecting generations by:

- Encouraging dance musicians and callers
- Promoting intergenerational dancing
- Fostering growth in the traditional dance community
- Providing opportunities and resources for dance organizing
- Providing financially and logistically accessible events
- Providing educational and mentoring opportunities
- Building community through social events

BIDA's founders hoped to create an organization which would strengthen community ties and provide opportunities for dancers, musicians, callers, and dance organizers to share knowledge and energy between generations.

After an extensive search, BIDA has settled in the Masonic Hall in Cambridge. In addition to having a large stage, a great floor, and a disco ball, this hall is less than a block from the Porter Square T station!

Gender Free Dancing in Boston

Lavender Country Folk Dancers (LCFD) is an umbrella organization forming a loosely knit group of gender-free dance clubs. (Sometimes the expression is "gender neutral," "gender role free," or "role optional"). It conducts events that encompass several dance traditions.

Jamaica Plain is home to both Contra and English Country Dances in a gender-role free environment. The dances are friendly and welcoming to all. Dances are held at First Church at the corner of Centre and Eliot Streets. Admission is \$10, \$6 for students, with a sliding scale.

LCFD's mission is to:

Organize and run dance camps, which are multiple-day events usually occurring at a rustic site.

Promote and support gender-free traditional dancing (contra, square, English country, and folk) primarily, but not exclusively, for gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, and queer dancers and friends.

Promote and support dance leaders, musicians, organizations, and others who support gender-free dancing, whenever possible.

LCFD is a non-profit organization that occasionally raises money for the purpose of supporting its activities. (For example, a very popular food booth at NEFFA.)

Why dance without gender roles? Gender-free dancing includes and celebrates all the dancers, and emphasizes the balance and symmetry of the dances. In dancing with everyone else, it creates community, both on and off the dance floor: our dancers move together to make it all happen. This approach was put forward by Carl Wittman (1943-1986), who recognized that dancers didn't need to be divided into male-female couples. English Country Dance, with its attention to symmetries of form, is especially suitable to gender-free dancing: each dancer in every position has an important role to play. The caller describes movement in ways that de-emphasize gender roles and couples, and uses simple cue words based on position.


