At a party on February 1 the Boston (Mass.) Country
Dance Society welcomed as a special guest Dr.
Kenworthy Schofield the well-known English scientist,
who is to be head of the Agronomy Department at
Cornell University. Dr. Schofield has for many years
taken an active interest in folk music and dancing in
England and is chairman of the executive committee
*of the *Country Dance Society there. He directed both*
English Country and Morris dancing at the party and
also delighted everyone present by playing his fa-
mous pipe and tabor which he prefers to call "whistle
and drum".

Readers of THE CALLER may remember what an
enthusiastic reception Paul Hunt received here last
year when he called for one of the C.D.S. Saturday
*Squares at the **Y.M.C. U. in Boston. It was an event*
worth repeating for he is a caller we all should know.
