The Board of Directors of the Country Dance Society-Boston Centre proposes changes on an as-needed basis to the Bylaws governing the organization. We are proposing the below amendments to (1) clarify some ambiguous terms, (2) establish a working number of Directors on the Board, (3) update our rules of procedure to a current document, and (4) release the organization from hurried and expensive procedures for a By Law change proposed by petition.

The below changes will be presented on the April ballot, and have been discussed and vetted by the current Directors. Please review them (and ask us any questions) prior to the April 2019 ballot.

Proposed amendments to CDS-BC Bylaws – January 2019

Additions to text are indicated by underscoring. Deletions are indicated by strikethrough.

3.2 Classes of membership.

Classes of membership, dues, and the duration of memberships shall be set by the Board. Members in good standing are considered voting members. The Board may provide for non-voting and honorary memberships.

Explanation: *The Bylaws use the term “voting members” in later sections without defining it.*

4.2 Directors.

There shall be ~~ten~~ six elected directors.

Explanation: *The Board proposes reducing the number of directors to reflect the difficulty in filling all the seats and to make it easier to reach a quorum.*

4.4 Schedule of elections of officers and directors.

The President-Elect is elected in the even-numbered years and, after completing the term of President-Elect automatically becomes President for two years. An individual may not serve more than two consecutive terms as President. The President automatically becomes Past President for one year following his or her tenure as President.

The Treasurer and Vice-President are elected in even-numbered years, and the Clerk in odd-numbered years. No officer may be elected to more than three consecutive full terms in the same office.

~~Five~~ Three directors shall be elected each year. No director may be elected to more than three consecutive full terms. CDS-BC representatives to other organizations shall serve in accordance with the Bylaws of those organizations. No representative shall be eligible for appointment to more than three consecutive full terms.

5.1

The Board consists of the ~~five~~ officers and ~~ten~~ the elected directors.

Explanation: *Numbers of officers and directors are given in Article IV and don't need to be repeated here.*

7.4 English Dance Committee

The English Dance Committee ~~shall consist of no more than nine members.~~ It shall be responsible for the planning and oversight of the English Dance activities, including regular and special events.

7.5 New England Dance Committee.

The New England Dance Committee ~~shall consist of no more than nine members.~~ It shall be responsible for the planning and oversight of the New England dance activities, including regular and special events.

Explanation: *There is no need to specify the number of members of standing committees in the Bylaws and omitting this provision allows more flexibility.*

9.1

Meetings of the membership, the Board and committees shall be conducted in a spirit of cooperation and respect for others. Questions or disputes about procedure shall be settled by reference to these Bylaws or, if necessary, to the most recent edition of Robert's Rules of Order the American Institute of Parliamentarians Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure.

Explanation: *Robert's Rules of Order is a well-known “brand” name, but few people are familiar with the details it contains. Its origins go back to the 19th century and it was designed for large deliberative assemblies, not for committees and boards of small non-profit organizations. The book is over 600 pages long. The American Institute of Parliamentarians code is half as long and has more simplified procedure. CDS-BC rarely has a need to refer to any formal rules of procedure, but if that becomes necessary, the AIP code should be sufficient.*

11.1

Amendments to the Bylaws may be proposed by the Board or by petition of fifteen or more members. ~~Any proposed amendment made by petition shall be submitted to the membership within sixty days after it is received by the Board.~~

11.2

The proposed amendment and a ballot for voting on it shall be sent to all voting members in conjunction with the next election of officers and directors with a return date ~~which is at least thirty days after the date the ballot is sent to the members.~~ The ballot shall include any explanation submitted by the sponsors of the amendment and the recommendations of the Board.

Explanation: *It is hard to imagine a change to the Bylaws that is so urgent that it is necessary to submit it to the members immediately. That creates an extra burden on the organization. It should be sufficient to vote on the amendments as part of the annual election process.*

For our English Ritual Dance program, we are excited to announce the return of **Laurel Swift** from Bristol, England to teach Morris, Clog, and to lead Ceilidh dancing. Laurel brings extensive expertise in English dance and music as well as unparalleled energy and joy in teaching. We are also excited to announce that **Judy Erickson** will be returning to teach Longsword. **Lily Leahy** will be coming all the way from Ireland to lead Harmony Singing, and we are so excited to have her back. **Jamie Beaton** and **John Mayberry** will lead Porch Singing. And last, but most certainly not least, the fabulous **Miss Laura Sprung** is bringing her fantastic crafting skills to share.

Our musical staff is brilliant as always featuring **Karen Axelrod**, **Alex Cumming**, **Doug Creighton**, and **Eric Martin** as well as the fantastic contra-dance band **Cloud 10**, featuring **Arthur Davis**, **Donal Sheets**, and **Cedar Stanistreet**.

By popular demand, we will be holding a Ceilidh again this year lead by Laurel and Alex! There will of course be the usual gatherings of after-parties, tea-parties, cocktail parties and general merriment. We can't wait to relax, dance and enjoy life at Pinewoods with you all! Please join us!
